SANI BULA

SANI BULA

(waves in the air,  
distracted)

Any redundant party can be resuscitated with enough money and members. Anyway, I mean- if we do that and revive a party...perhaps we can get the deputy governor to move to our side with his entire structure...

JINJIRI

(nodding in understanding)  
And then infuse the party with enough power, Ko? But...how would you get him to defect and then hand over the seat to Nuhu to run?

SANI BULA

We offer him something juicy instead: a Ministerial position

JINJIRI

Are you sure he would accept? Besides, he's said to be extremely loyal to ACT party.

SANI BULA
